Investigate the life cycle of a butterfly and see how you can record it.




Plant some seeds and watch them grow. Big seeds are easier to handle. Try sunflowers, peas, beans and nasturtiums. (flowers you can eat!)

We will be trying to ensure everyone has mastered forming the lower case letters correctly and introducing capital letters.

We would really appreciate any support you can give at home with letter formation. Each letter should be written in one go not 'ball and stick'.

Maths

At school we use ten frames a lot. Ten frames are simple but highly useful tools that allow children to "see" numbers. They make it easy to picture how the numbers 1-10 relate to one another and help develop a good number sense using 5 and 10 as benchmarks.

You could make your own at home with an eggbox. Use it to practise counting on and taking away.

Science

We will be investigating how plants grow and where some of our food comes from.

Vocabulary

Life cycles - Egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, butterfly.

Plants - Stem, leaf, bud, roots, shoot, flower, petal, seed, germinate, Farm animal names and their babies - cow/calf, pig/piglet, goat/kid, etc



We continue to practise reading longer words with a focus on words starting or ending with 2 or 3 consonants next to each other eg. pram, frog, spring, tent, lamp.

We learn to read compound words made up of two independent words eg carpark, windmill, handstand, sandpit

We look at recognising word endings 'ing', 'ed' and 'est' and what these mean.

New Tricky Words said, so, have, like some, come, love, do were, here, little, says there, when, what, one out, today
