## WHO JOURNEYS FAR FROM HOME AND WHY?

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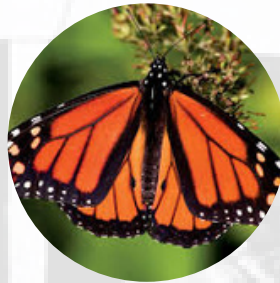
### School Value - Equality

Find out how turtles travel thousands of miles. Can you recreate their shell patterns?



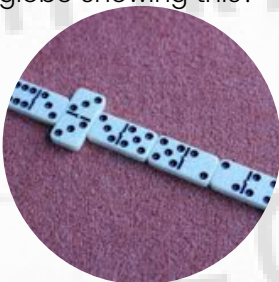
Watch the routes that animals journey around the world. Can you make your own map or globe showing this?

Make your own Notting Hill Carnival headdress!

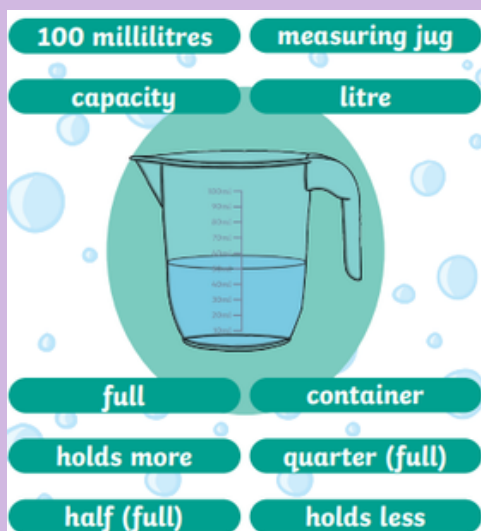
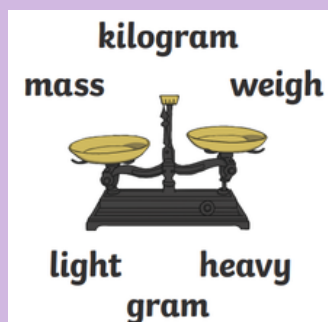

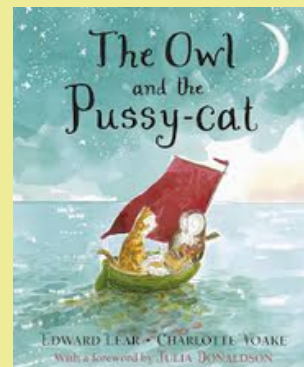
